I now am dedicated to empowering my people and Community through Culture and building resilience within my people by keeping our culture alive.

This painting represents Aboriginal Family Support Services and their connection to families and country. It illustrates the journey of building strong, resilient families and a healthy community. The hands symbolise our ancestors and the artist, reflecting pride in our ancient culture. The circles represent songlines, while the Aboriginal stars depict the Seven Sisters, connecting women to Dreaming. The emu and kangaroo signify progress, as they only move forward. Tarnda and Karrawirra Pari represent Kaurna country, and the dots signify the 500 Aboriginal clan groups of Australia.
